Acupuncture - Qualifications for Licensure

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain qualifications for licensure in acupuncture;

4 increasing the number of clinical hours required to meet a certain acupuncture

- 5 training standard; repealing certain training requirements that are either
- 6 approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission, accredited by a
- 7 certain national entity, or found by the State Board of Acupuncture to have a
- 8 certain equivalency; requiring as a condition of licensure that an applicant for
- 9 licensure, in addition to meeting a certain training requirement, pass a certain
- 10 examination; altering the name of a certain national examining entity; and
- 11 generally relating to certain qualifications for licensure in acupuncture.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the 22 requirements of this section.

- 23 (b) The applicant shall:
- 24 (1) Be of good moral character;
- 25 (2) Be at least 18 years old;
- 26 (3) Demonstrate competence in performing acupuncture by meeting [one 27 of] the following standards [for education or training]:

HOUSE BILL 985 1 Graduation from a course of training of at least 1,800 hours, (i) 2 including [300] 500 clinical [hours,] HOURS; [that is: 3 1. Approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission; 4 2. Accredited by the National Accreditation Commission for 5 Schools and Colleges of Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine; or Found by the Board to be equivalent to a course approved 6 3. 7 by the National Accreditation Commission for Schools and Colleges of Acupuncture 8 and Oriental Medicine; or] AND 9 (ii) Achievement of a passing score on an examination that is: 10 1. Given by the National CERTIFICATION Commission for 11 [the Certification of Acupuncturists] ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE; or 12 2. Determined by the Board to be equivalent to the 13 examination given by the National CERTIFICATION Commission for [the Certification 14 of Acupuncturists] ACUPUNCTURE AND ORIENTAL MEDICINE; 15 (4)Demonstrate the ability to communicate in the English language; 16 and 17 Meet any other qualifications that the Board establishes in (5) 18 regulations.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 1998.
