A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Home Inspectors**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a State Board of Home Inspectors in the Department
4 of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; providing for the membership, powers, and
5 duties of the Board; requiring an individual to be licensed before the individual
6 may engage in the business of performing home inspections in the State or
7 conduct home inspections under the supervision of a licensed home inspector in
8 the State; establishing requirements that must be met to be licensed; providing
9 for the issuance, scope, term, renewal, and reinstatement of licenses;
10 authorizing the Board to deny a license to any applicant, reprimand a licensee,
11 or suspend or revoke a license under certain circumstances; providing for certain
12 hearings under certain circumstances; providing for certain home inspection
13 reports within a certain period of time; prohibiting certain acts and providing for
14 certain penalties; requiring the Board to grant a certain waiver of requirements
15 under certain circumstances; specifying the terms of the initial members of the
16 Board; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the licensing and
17 regulation of home inspectors by the State Board of Home Inspectors.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

5 (A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

6 (B) "ASSOCIATE HOME INSPECTOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
7 EMPLOYED BY A LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR TO CONDUCT A HOME INSPECTION OF
8 A RESIDENTIAL BUILDING ON BEHALF OF THE LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR.

9 (C) "BOARD" MEANS THE STATE BOARD OF HOME INSPECTORS.

10 (D) "HOME INSPECTION" MEANS A WRITTEN EVALUATION OF ONE OR MORE
11 OF THE COMPONENTS OF A RESIDENTIAL BUILDING, INCLUDING THE HEATING
12 SYSTEM, COOLING SYSTEM, PLUMBING SYSTEM, ELECTRICAL SYSTEM, STRUCTURAL
13 COMPONENTS, FOUNDATION, ROOF, MASONRY STRUCTURE, EXTERIOR AND
14 INTERIOR COMPONENTS, OR ANY OTHER RELATED RESIDENTIAL HOUSING
15 COMPONENT.

16 (E) "HOME INSPECTOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO ENGAGES IN THE
17 BUSINESS OF PERFORMING HOME INSPECTIONS FOR COMPENSATION.

18 (F) (1) "LICENSE" MEANS, UNLESS THE CONTEXT REQUIRES OTHERWISE, A
19 LICENSE ISSUED BY THE BOARD TO ENGAGE IN OR TO ASSIST IN ENGAGING IN THE
20 BUSINESS OF PERFORMING HOME INSPECTIONS.

21 (2) "LICENSE" INCLUDES, UNLESS THE CONTEXT REQUIRES
22 OTHERWISE:

23 (I) A HOME INSPECTOR LICENSE; AND

24 (II) AN ASSOCIATE HOME INSPECTOR LICENSE.

25 (G) "LICENSED ASSOCIATE HOME INSPECTOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS
26 LICENSED BY THE BOARD TO CONDUCT HOME INSPECTIONS UNDER THE
27 SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR.

28 (H) "LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LICENSED
29 BY THE BOARD TO ENGAGE IN THE BUSINESS OF PERFORMING HOME INSPECTIONS.

31 THE PURPOSE OF THIS TITLE IS TO ESTABLISH A LICENSING PROGRAM FOR
32 INDIVIDUALS WHO ENGAGE IN THE BUSINESS OF PERFORMING HOME INSPECTIONS

- 1 (1) PROTECT THE PUBLIC;
- 2 (2) PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN EFFICIENT AND SAFE COMPONENTS OF
3 RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS;
- 4 (3) PROMOTE HIGH PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS; AND
- 5 (4) ENSURE THAT QUALIFIED INDIVIDUALS CARRY OUT ITEMS (1), (2),

- 9 (1) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS EMPLOYED AS A BUILDING CODE

11 STATE, WHILE ACTING WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THAT EMPLOYMENT;
- 12 (2) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LICENSED AS A PLUMBER UNDER TITLE 12
13 OF THE BUSINESS OCCUPATIONS AND PROFESSIONS ARTICLE;
- 14 (3) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LICENSED AS AN ELECTRICIAN UNDER TITLE
15 6 OF THE BUSINESS OCCUPATIONS AND PROFESSIONS ARTICLE;
- 16 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS LICENSED AS A HEATING, VENTILATION,

25 THERE IS A STATE BOARD OF HOME INSPECTORS IN THE DEPARTMENT.

26 9B-202.

- 27 (A) (1) THE BOARD CONSISTS OF EIGHT MEMBERS.
- 28 (2) OF THE EIGHT BOARD MEMBERS:
- 29 (I) ONE SHALL BE THE SECRETARY OR THE SECRETARY'S
30 DESIGNEE;
- 31 (II) FOUR SHALL BE HOME INSPECTORS;

1 (III) ONE SHALL BE A LICENSED REAL ESTATE BROKER; AND

2 (IV) TWO SHALL BE CONSUMER MEMBERS.

3 (3) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD
4 WITH THE ADVICE OF THE SECRETARY AND WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE
5 SENATE.

6 (B) EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD SHALL BE:

7 (1) A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES; AND

18 (E) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 4 YEARS AND BEGINS ON JULY 1.

19 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY THE
20 TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD ON OCTOBER 1, 1998.

21 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A
22 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

23 (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
24 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
25 QUALIFIES.

26 (5) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE A MEMBER FOR INCOMPETENCE OR
27 MISCONDUCT.

29 (A) THE BOARD SHALL ELECT A CHAIRMAN AND A VICE CHAIRMAN FROM
30 AMONG ITS MEMBERS.

31 (B) THE MANNER OF ELECTION OF OFFICERS SHALL BE AS THE BOARD
32 DETERMINES.

2 (A) (1) THE BOARD SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE EACH YEAR IN A
3 LOCATION DETERMINED BY THE BOARD.

4 (2) SPECIAL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD MAY BE HELD IF CALLED BY THE
5 CHAIRMAN OR ANY TWO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

15 IN ADDITION TO ANY POWERS SET FORTH ELSEWHERE, THE BOARD SHALL:

16 (1) ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS TITLE;

17 (2) ADOPT AND ENFORCE A CODE OF ETHICS AND STANDARD OF
18 PRACTICE FOR INDIVIDUALS LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE;

19 (3) DETERMINE THE QUALIFICATIONS AND FITNESS OF APPLICANTS

28 (A) THE BOARD MAY INVESTIGATE ANY COMPLAINT THAT ALLEGES FACTS
29 THAT CONSTITUTE A VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE.

1 (B) ON RECEIPT OF THE RESULTS OF AN INVESTIGATION MADE UNDER THIS
2 SECTION, THE BOARD PROMPTLY SHALL TAKE ACTION THAT IS APPROPRIATE UNDER
3 THIS TITLE TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THIS TITLE.

4 (C) (1) IF THE BOARD CONCLUDES THAT ANY CONDUCT ALLEGED TO BE IN
5 VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE WILL RESULT IN HARM TO ANY CITIZEN OF THE STATE,
6 THE BOARD MAY SEEK A PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION WITH RESPECT
7 TO THE CONDUCT FROM THE CIRCUIT COURT OF ANY COUNTY IN WHICH THE
8 ALLEGED VIOLATION OCCURS, OR IN WHICH THE VIOLATOR HAS ITS PRINCIPAL
9 PLACE OF BUSINESS.

10 (2) IN SEEKING AN INJUNCTION UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD
11 IS NOT REQUIRED TO:

12 (I) POST BOND;

13 (II) ALLEGE OR PROVE THAT AN ADEQUATE REMEDY AT LAW DOES
14 NOT EXIST; OR

15 (III) ALLEGE OR PROVE THAT SUBSTANTIAL OR IRREPARABLE
16 DAMAGE WOULD RESULT FROM THE CONTINUED VIOLATION OF THE PROVISION.

17 (D) (1) ANY FIVE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD, OR A HEARING OFFICER
18 DESIGNATED BY THE BOARD, MAY ADMINISTER OATHS, HOLD HEARINGS, AND TAKE
19 TESTIMONY ABOUT ALL MATTERS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD.

20 (2) THE BOARD, OR ITS DESIGNEE, MAY TAKE TESTIMONY OF ANY
21 PERSON BY DEPOSITION IN THE SAME MANNER AS IN JUDICIAL PROCEEDINGS IN
22 STATE CIVIL CASES.

23 (3) ANY PARTY TO ANY HEARING BEFORE THE BOARD HAS THE RIGHT
24 TO ATTENDANCE OF WITNESSES, AFTER MAKING A REQUEST TO THE BOARD AND
25 DESIGNATING THE PERSON SOUGHT TO BE SUBPOENAED.

26 (4) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY NOT BE HELD PERSONALLY LIABLE
27 FOR ANY ACTION TAKEN UNDER THIS SECTION.

28 (E) (1) THE BOARD OR ITS DESIGNEE MAY ISSUE A SUBPOENA.

29 (2) THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF BALTIMORE CITY OR THE SHERIFF OF
30 A COUNTY SHALL SERVE A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

31 (3) IF A PERSON FAILS TO COMPLY WITH A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER
32 THIS SUBSECTION, ON PETITION OF THE BOARD, A COURT OF COMPETENT
33 JURISDICTION MAY COMPEL COMPLIANCE WITH THE SUBPOENA.

9 TO BE EXAMINED AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

10 (B) THE BOARD SHALL GIVE EXAMINATIONS TO APPLICANTS AT THE TIMES
11 AND PLACES THAT THE BOARD DETERMINES.

12 (C) THE BOARD SHALL GIVE EACH QUALIFIED APPLICANT NOTICE OF THE
13 TIME AND PLACE OF EXAMINATION.

14 (D) (1) THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE SUBJECTS, SCOPE, AND FORM

22 AN APPLICANT FOR A LICENSE SHALL:

23 (1) SUBMIT TO THE BOARD AN APPLICATION ON THE FORM THAT THE
24 BOARD PROVIDES; AND

25 (2) PAY TO THE BOARD AN APPLICATION FEE SET BY THE BOARD.

27 (A) THE BOARD:

28 (1) SHALL REVIEW EACH APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE SUBMITTED TO

19 (D) IF THE BOARD REJECTS AN APPLICATION, THE NOTICE SENT TO THE
20 APPLICANT MUST STATE THE REASONS FOR THE REJECTION.

21 (E) THE BOARD SHALL ISSUE A LICENSE TO EACH APPLICANT WHO MEETS
22 THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBTITLE.

23 9B-306.

24 (A) WHILE A HOME INSPECTOR LICENSE IS IN EFFECT, IT AUTHORIZES THE
25 LICENSEE TO ENGAGE IN THE BUSINESS OF PERFORMING HOME INSPECTIONS.

26 (B) WHILE AN ASSOCIATE HOME INSPECTOR LICENSE IS IN EFFECT, IT
27 AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO CONDUCT HOME INSPECTIONS UNDER THE
28 SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED HOME INSPECTOR.

29 9B-307.

30 (A) UNLESS A LICENSE IS RENEWED FOR A 1-YEAR TERM AS PROVIDED IN
31 THIS SECTION, THE LICENSE EXPIRES ON THE FIRST OCTOBER 1 THAT COMES AFTER
32 ITS EFFECTIVE DATE.

33 (B) AT LEAST 1 MONTH BEFORE A LICENSE EXPIRES, THE BOARD SHALL MAIL
