6 member; specifying the terms of the members; providing that the Board shall

7 have no authority over nonpublic schools; transferring full authority to the

8 Board to propose rules and regulations concerning the certification of certain

9 school personnel; requiring the State Board of Education to review the proposed

10 rules and regulations; requiring the State Board to adopt the proposed rules and

11 regulations unless certain circumstances exist; and generally relating to the

12 certification of certain school personnel by the Professional Standards and

13 Teacher Education Board.

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 6	There is a Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board in the State Department of Education.

8 9	(a) (1) The Board consists of [25] 12 REGULAR members AND ONE TEACHER EDUCATION STUDENT MEMBER.
10	(2) Of the [25] 12 Board members:
11	(i) [8] SIX shall be public school classroom teachers, as follows:
	1. [6] FOUR shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by the statewide teachers' organization representing a majority of teachers in the State for collective bargaining purposes; and
17	2. [2] ONE shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by a statewide teachers' organization representing teachers in at least one jurisdiction within the State for collective bargaining purposes other than the majority organization provided for in item 1 of this subparagraph;
19 20	3. ONE SHALL BE SELECTED FROM ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM IN THE STATE.
21 22	(ii) [1] ONE shall be a certified nonpublic school classroom teacher, chosen from a list of nominees provided by the Association of Independent Schools;
23 24	(iii) [6] TWO shall be teacher education faculty members from colleges of the State, chosen from a list of nominees provided by:
25	1. The Maryland Association of Teacher Educators; and
26 27	2. The Maryland Association of Colleges of Teacher Education;
28 29	(iv) [4] ONE shall be A SCHOOL-BASED administrative or supervisory staff [members] MEMBER of A public [schools, as follows:
30 31	1. 2 shall be] SCHOOL chosen from a list of nominees provided by the Public School Superintendents' Association of Maryland;
32	[2. 1 shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by the

33 Maryland Association of Secondary Principals; and

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13.1 shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by the2Maryland Association of Elementary School Administrators;
3 (v) 2 shall be administrative or supervisory staff of the approved 4 nonpublic schools of the State, chosen from a list of nominees provided by the 5 Association of Independent Schools;]
6 [(vi) 1](V) ONE shall be a member of a local Board of Education, 7 chosen from a list of nominees provided by the Maryland Association of Boards of 8 Education;
9 [(vii) 2 shall be representatives of the general public, as follows:
101.1 shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by the11Speaker of the House of Delegates of Maryland; and
 2. 1 shall be chosen from a list of nominees provided by the President of the Senate of Maryland; and
14 (viii) 1](VI) ONE shall be the State Superintendent or a designee of 15 the State Superintendent; AND
 16 (VII) ONE SHALL BE A TEACHER PREPARATION STUDENT IN AN 17 ACCREDITED MARYLAND TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM CHOSEN FROM A LIST OF 18 NOMINEES PROVIDED BY THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION OF TEACHER EDUCATORS.
19[(3)The Board shall include all the members of the Professional20Standards and Teacher Education Advisory Board serving on July 1, 1991.]
 (b) (1) The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate of Maryland, shall appoint the members of the Board described in subsection (a)(2)(i) through (vii) of this section.
 (2) In making the appointments required under this subsection, the 25 Governor shall ensure that the Board is representative of:
26 (i) The geographic regions of the State; and
27(ii)Minority populations of the State as defined in § 9-301 of the28State Government Article.
 (c) (1) The term of an appointed member is 3 years, EXCEPT THE TERM OF THE TEACHER EDUCATION STUDENT MEMBER, WHOSE TERM SHALL BE 1 YEAR.
31 (2) The terms of the appointed members are staggered as required by the 32 terms provided for members of the Board on October 1, 1991.
 33 (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is 34 appointed.

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1 2	(4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the remainder of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
3 4	(5) A MEMBER IS ELIGIBLE FOR REAPPOINTMENT BUT MAY NOT SERVE FOR MORE THAN TWO FULL 3-YEAR TERMS.
5	(d) The Governor may remove a member for incompetence or misconduct.
6	(e) From among its members, the Board annually shall elect a chairman.
7 8	(f) A majority of the members of the Board then serving on the Board is a quorum.
9	(g) The staff for the Board shall be provided by the State Board.

13	 (a) (1) In accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 1 of the State Government Article, [both the State Board and] the Board shall [develop for consideration] PROPOSE rules and regulations, CONSISTENT WITH FORMALLY ADOPTED GOALS OF THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT, for:
15 16	(i) The certification of teachers and other professional personnel in accordance with this article; and
17 18	(ii) Requirements for preparation of teachers and other education personnel.
19 20	(2) Rules and regulations developed by the State Board shall be reviewed by the Board.

	 PROPOSED RULES AND REGULATIONS DEVELOPED BY THE BOARD SHALL BE REVIEWED, WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THEIR RECEIPT, BY THE STATE BOARD AND TWO OR MORE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE BOARD.
28 29 30	 (3) FOLLOWING THE REQUIRED REVIEW AND DISCUSSION, PROPOSED RULES AND REGULATIONS DEVELOPED BY THE BOARD SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED UNLESS RETURNED TO THE BOARD BY REASON OF INCOMPATIBILITY WITH ADOPTED GOALS OF THE STATE BOARD. A JOINT MEETING OF THE BOARD AND THE STATE BOARD SHALL BE CONVENED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF ANY SUCH RETURN FOR THE PURPOSE OF RESOLVING SUCH INCOMPATIBILITY.

 Board] shall be implemented unless disapproved by [three-fourths of the] EIGHT
 members of the State Board, NOT INCLUDING THE STUDENT MEMBER. THE STATE
 BOARD'S AUTHORITY TO DISAPPROVE SHALL BE BASED SOLELY ON THE STATE
 BOARD'S ABILITY TO SUBSTANTIATE THAT THE RECOMMENDED RULES OR

13 [(8)] (5) An individual who is otherwise qualified may not be denied the 14 right to receive credentials from the Board, to receive training to become a teacher, or 15 to practice teaching in any school because that individual is totally or partially blind.

16 [(9)] (6) A county board may not refuse to contract with or engage a 17 teacher because of blindness if the blind teacher is capable of performing the duties of 18 the position for which [he] THE TEACHER has applied.

19 [(10)] (7) The right of a school psychologist, who is certified by the Board 20 to practice school psychology consistent with the provisions of that certification, may 21 not be limited by Title 18 of the Health Occupations Article with respect to the

22 practice of school psychology in an educational institution.

23 (b) The Board may establish a fee, not to exceed \$10, for issuance or renewal of 24 a teacher certificate. The Board may not require a fee:

25 (1) For the addition of any new area of certification to a currently valid 26 certificate; or

27 (2) Except for the fee authorized under this subsection, for the 28 evaluation of credentials for the certification of teachers.

29 (C) THE BOARD SHALL HAVE NO AUTHORITY OVER NONPUBLIC ELEMENTARY 30 AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

(D) EXCEPT FOR A REQUIREMENT FOR A TEACHER CERTIFICATION TEST, THE
STATE SUPERINTENDENT HAS THE AUTHORITY TO WAIVE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS
FOR A CERTIFICATE IN AN INDIVIDUAL CASE, IF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT
DETERMINES, AFTER THOROUGH INVESTIGATION THAT THE APPLICANT'S
PREPARATION OR EXPERTISE, OR BOTH, ARE ADEQUATE TO JUSTIFY A WAIVER. THE
SUPERINTENDENT SHALL MAKE QUARTERLY REPORTS TO THE BOARD ON THE
NUMBER OF WAIVERS GRANTED BY SUBDIVISION AND THE REASONS FOR GRANTING
THEM.

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- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Professional
- 2 Standards and Teacher Education Board, as it existed immediately prior to the3 effective date of this Act, is hereby abolished. Members of the abolished Board are
- 4 eligible for appointment to the new Board created under this Act.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 1998.
