10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 15 INDICATED.

16 (2) "NATIONAL GUARD" MEANS THE ARMY NATIONAL GUARD, THE AIR 17 NATIONAL GUARD, OR THE MARYLAND DEFENSE FORCE.

18 (3) "VETERAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

19(I) SERVED ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE20UNITED STATES DURING A TIME OF CONFLICT, AS DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF21DEFENSE; OR

22 (II) SERVED AS A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD AND DIED 23 WHILE A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD.

24 (B) (A) (1) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY ORGANIZE A UNIFORMED 25 HONOR GUARD FROM THE NATIONAL GUARD OR THE ORGANIZED MILITIA TO 26 ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN IF:

27 (I) THE COMMANDER OF AN ACCREDITED VETERANS'
28 ORGANIZATION OR A FRIEND OR RELATIVE OF THE DECEASED VETERAN REQUESTS
29 AN HONOR GUARD TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE;

30(II)A UNIFORMED HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED31FORCES OR VETERANS' ORGANIZATION IS NOT AVAILABLE; AND

(III) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL DETERMINES THAT PROVISION OF
AN HONOR GUARD WILL NOT HAVE A DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE READINESS OF
THE NATIONAL GUARD IN THE EVENT OF A STATE OR FEDERAL EMERGENCY OR THE
EMPLOYMENT OF A NATIONAL GUARD MEMBER.

(2) IF AN HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED FORCES IS NOT
 AVAILABLE, THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY REQUEST AN HONOR GUARD FROM A
 VETERANS' ORGANIZATION TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED
 VETERAN.

5 (C) THE HONOR GUARD SHALL PERFORM AS A MILITARY HONOR GUARD AND 6 A SQUAD TO FIRE VOLLEYS AT THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.

7 (D) THE HONOR GUARD SHALL CONSIST OF NOT MORE THAN FIVE RIFLE 8 BEARERS AND A BUGLER.

9(E)(B)REASONABLE COMPENSATION OF HONOR GUARD MEMBERS SHALL10BE SET BY THE ADJUTANT GENERAL, BUT NOT TO EXCEED 75% OF 1 DAY'S BASIC PAY,11PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A12DECEASED VETERAN.

13(C)THE ADJUTANT GENERAL SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO14IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

15 (F) (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROVIDE, IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET,
16 SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE COMPENSATION OF:

17 (I) THE HONOR GUARDS; AND

18 (II) THE NATIONAL GUARD PERSONNEL WHO COORDINATE HONOR
 19 GUARD PARTICIPATION IN THE BURIAL SERVICES.

20 (2) COMPENSATION OF HONOR GUARD MEMBERS SHALL BE AT THE

21 RATE OF 75% OF 1 DAY'S BASIC PAY; HOWEVER, THE COMPENSATION MAY NOT BE

22 LESS THAN \$30 NOR MORE THAN \$60 PER DAY, PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO

23 PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

25 October 1, 1998.
