## Militia - Honor Guard at Burial Service of Veteran

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Adjutant General to organize an honor guard
- 4 from the National Guard or the organized militia to attend the burial services of
- 5 certain veterans under certain circumstances; authorizing the Adjutant General
- 6 to request an honor guard from a certain veterans' organization to attend the
- 7 burial service of a certain veteran under certain circumstances; providing for the
- 8 composition of the honor guard; requiring the Governor Adjutant General to
- 9 adopt regulations to implement this Act; providing the Adjutant General with
- 10 the funds to compensate the honor guards and a certain staff at a certain rate;
- and generally relating to militia and an honor guard at the burial service of a
- 12 certain veteran.

- 1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article 65 - Militia 4 6. IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 5 <del>(A)</del> (1)6 INDICATED. "NATIONAL GUARD" MEANS THE ARMY NATIONAL GUARD, THE AIR 8 NATIONAL GUARD, OR THE MARYLAND DEFENSE FORCE. 9 (3)"VETERAN" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO: <del>(I)</del> SERVED ON ACTIVE DUTY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE 11 UNITED STATES DURING A TIME OF CONFLICT, AS DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF 12 DEFENSE; OR SERVED AS A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD AND DIED 13 (II)14 WHILE A MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL GUARD. THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY ORGANIZE A UNIFORMED 15 <del>(B)</del> (A) (1) 16 HONOR GUARD FROM THE NATIONAL GUARD OR THE ORGANIZED MILITIA TO 17 ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN IF: THE COMMANDER OF AN ACCREDITED VETERANS' (I) 19 ORGANIZATION OR A FRIEND OR RELATIVE OF THE DECEASED VETERAN REQUESTS 20 AN HONOR GUARD TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE; 21 A UNIFORMED HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED (II)22 FORCES OR VETERANS' ORGANIZATION IS NOT AVAILABLE; AND THE ADJUTANT GENERAL DETERMINES THAT PROVISION OF 23 (III)24 AN HONOR GUARD WILL NOT HAVE A DETRIMENTAL EFFECT ON THE READINESS OF 25 THE NATIONAL GUARD IN THE EVENT OF A STATE OR FEDERAL EMERGENCY OR THE 26 EMPLOYMENT OF A NATIONAL GUARD MEMBER. IF AN HONOR GUARD FROM THE ACTIVE ARMED FORCES IS NOT 27 28 AVAILABLE, THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY REQUEST AN HONOR GUARD FROM A 29 VETERANS' ORGANIZATION TO ATTEND THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED 30 VETERAN. 31 THE HONOR GUARD SHALL PERFORM AS A MILITARY HONOR GUARD AND 32 A SOUAD TO FIRE VOLLEYS AT THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.
- THE HONOR GUARD SHALL CONSIST OF NOT MORE THAN FIVE RIFLE 33 <del>(D)</del> 34 BEARERS AND A BUGLER.

## **HOUSE BILL 1052**

- 1 (E) (B) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO 2 IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.
- 3 (F) (1) THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROVIDE, IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET,
- 4 SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE COMPENSATION OF:
- 5 (I) THE HONOR GUARDS; AND
- 6 (II) THE NATIONAL GUARD PERSONNEL WHO COORDINATE HONOR 7 GUARD PARTICIPATION IN THE BURIAL SERVICES.
- 8 (2) COMPENSATION OF HONOR GUARD MEMBERS SHALL BE AT THE
- 9 RATE OF 75% OF 1 DAY'S BASIC PAY; HOWEVER, THE COMPENSATION MAY NOT BE
- 10 LESS THAN \$30 NOR MORE THAN \$60 PER DAY, PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO
- 11 PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 October 1, 1998.
