- 14 (ii) Two members of the House of Delegates appointed by the

- 16 (iii) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the

- 18 (iv) Two representatives of organized labor, nominated by the
- 19 AFL-CIO and appointed by the Governor; and
- 20 (v) Two representatives of business, nominated by the Maryland
- 21 Chamber of Commerce and appointed by the Governor.
- 22 (2) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Commission from
- 23 among the members appointed by the Governor under paragraph (1)(i) of this
- 24 subsection.
- 25 (c) The Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation shall provide staff to 26 the Commission.
