- 4 WITHOUT COMPLETING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE. WHEREAS THIS
- 5 PROFESSION IS INTRICATELY LINKED TO THE COORDINATION OF SHIP MOVEMENT
- 6 AND TUG ASSISTANCE, A THOROUGH KNOWLEDGE OF TUGBOATS AND THEIR
- 7 LIMITATIONS AN CAPABILITIES IS ESSENTIAL BOTH TO THE SAFETY OF THE SHIP
- 8 AND THE TUGBOAT. THEREFORE, AN ACCOMPANYING LETTER OF
- 9 RECOMMENDATION FROM A LOCAL SHIP ASSIST TUGBOAT COMPANY MUST
- 10 ACCOMPANY THESE INDIVIDUALS. REITERATING THEIR COMPETENCY.
