- 19 performance security in addition to, or in cases other than, those specified under §§
- 20 17-103, 17-104, 17-106, and 17-107 of this subtitle.
- 21 (b) This subtitle applies only to security for a construction contract.
- 22 (c) By ordinance, Baltimore City may provide for a program to satisfy the
- 23 bonding requirements under §§ 17-103, 17-104, 17-106, and 17-107 of this subtitle
- 24 with respect to any construction contract:
- 25 (1) that does not exceed [\$100,000] \$200,000; and
