- 1 (b) Unless approved by the Commission, a bill for funeral expenses of more 2 than [\$2,500] \$5,000 is void and uncollectable out of:
- 3 (1) workers' compensation benefits payable with respect to the deceased 4 covered employee; or
- 5 (2) personal assets of any person to whom workers' compensation 6 benefits are payable with respect to the deceased covered employee.
