### 1 AN ACT concerning

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### County Boards of Education <u>Education - Noncertificated Employees</u> -Prohibitions on Hiring

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a county board of education from hiring an individual

- 5 to work in a public school in the county under certain circumstances that effect
- 6 the safety of children or reflect on the honesty of the individual; making certain
- 7 stylistic changes; requiring the county board <u>State Board of Education</u> to adopt
- 8 certain rules and regulations; and generally relating to hiring of public school
- 9 employees by a county board of education. requiring the State Board of
- 10 Education to adopt regulations that prohibit the hiring, by county boards of
- 11 education, of noncertificated employees who have been convicted of certain
- 12 crimes; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to the
- 13 hiring of noncertificated employees by county boards of education.
