3 4	(b) (1) The Governor may not reduce an appropriation to the Legislative Branch or the Judicial Branch of the State government.
5	(2) The Governor may not reduce an appropriation for:
6	(i) payment of the principal of or interest on the State debt;
7 8	(ii) public schools, including the Maryland School for the Deaf AND THE MARYLAND SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND; or
9	(iii) the salary of a public officer, during the term of office.
	(3) Except as provided in § 8-109 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, the Governor may not reduce an appropriation for the salary of any nontemporary employee in the State Personnel Management System.
13	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
	(a) The provisions of this Act relating to the formula for determining annual appropriations for the Maryland School for the Blind may not be implemented until the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 1999.
	(b) The provisions of this Act created in § 8-315 of the Education Article relating to funding for the program of enhanced services for blind students who have severe disabilities shall be implemented for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 1998.
20	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
	(a) Any person who is a member of the Board of Trustees when this Act becomes effective shall continue to serve on the Board of Trustees until the end of the person's term.
	(b) Each vacancy occurring after the effective date of this Act shall be filled by a member appointed by the Governor and the Superintendent until the total number of members appointed by the Governor and Superintendent is five.
