20 WHEREAS, The Maryland School for the Blind provides an essential service for 21 some blind children in the State; and

22 WHEREAS, A minimum level of funding is necessary to cover the costs of

23 inflation and enrollment growth and to ensure adequate maintenance of the School's24 existing programs; and

WHEREAS, Education programs and other services to the School's students should not be reduced or disrupted during the school year as a result of mid-year appropriation reductions; and

WHEREAS, There is a need to expand the educational options in Maryland forstudents who have other severe disabilities; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Department of Education has the responsibility tomonitor the programs provided by the School; now, therefore,
