5 administer oaths, issue certain subpoenas, and cause certain depositions to be 6 taken; providing for judicial enforcement of certain subpoenas; providing that 7 false swearing by a witness before the Committee is perjury; and generally relating to enforcement powers of the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Government

18 (A) IN CARRYING OUT ANY OF ITS FUNCTIONS OR POWERS, THE COMMITTEE 19 MAY:

20 (1) ADMINISTER OATHS;
21 (2) ISSUE SUBPOENAS FOR THE ATTENDANCE OF WITNESSES TO
22 TESTIFY OR TO PRODUCE EVIDENCE; AND
23 (3) CAUSE THE DEPOSITIONS OF WITNESSES, WHO RESIDE IN OR 24 OUTSIDE OF THE STATE, TO BE TAKEN IN THE MANNER PROVIDED BY LAW FOR 25 TAKING DEPOSITIONS IN A CIVIL CASE.

26 (B) A SUBPOENA ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE JUDICIALLY
27 ENFORCED.

1 (C) FALSE SWEARING BY A WITNESS BEFORE THE COMMITTEE IS PERJURY.
2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 3 October 1, 1998.
