A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Alcoholic Beverages - Pub-Brewery Licenses**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain exemption to a certain alcoholic beverages
4 provision so as to allow the holder of a Class 6 pub-brewery license to apply for
5 and obtain certain additional manufacturer's licenses under certain conditions;
6 and generally relating to the issuance of manufacturer's licenses for alcoholic
7 beverages.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

17 (a) The annual fees for manufacturer's licenses are as follows:

18	Class 1	Distillery	\$ 2,000
19	Class 2	Rectifying	\$ 600
20	Class 3	Winery	\$ 750
21	Class 4	Limited Winery	\$ 200
22	Class 5	Brewery	\$ 1,500
23	Class 6	Pub-Brewery	\$ 500
24	Class 7	Micro-Brewery	\$ 500

25 (b) (1) [Except for a Class 6 pub-brewery license, the] THE holder of a
26 distillery, rectifying, winery or brewery license may apply for and obtain, under a
27 different name, one or more additional distillery, rectifying, winery or brewery
28 licenses for the same or another premises. Those licenses may be issued to different

1 persons or under trade names used by persons occupying a part of or all of the same
2 premises.

3 (2) The holder of a rectifying, winery or brewery license may apply for
4 and obtain a wholesaler's license of any class for the same premises or elsewhere as
5 provided under this article.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 1998.
