SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24	Class 7	Micro-Brewery	\$ 500

- 25 [Except for a Class 6 pub-brewery license, the] THE holder of a (1)
- 26 distillery, rectifying, winery or brewery license may apply for and obtain, under a
- 27 different name, one or more additional distillery, rectifying, winery or brewery
- 28 licenses for the same or another premises. Those licenses may be issued to different

- 1 persons or under trade names used by persons occupying a part of or all of the same 2 premises.
- 3 (2) The holder of a rectifying, winery or brewery license may apply for 4 and obtain a wholesaler's license of any class for the same premises or elsewhere as
- 5 provided under this article.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 7 October 1, 1998.
