- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) (1) For any license issued for which the authority to conduct a program 18 under this subtitle has been delegated to a county health department:
- 19 (i) A county governing body or the Mayor and City Council of
- 20 Baltimore City may provide for a license fee schedule based on the anticipated cost of
- 21 licensing, inspecting, and regulating food establishments and may provide for
- 22 exemptions from the license fee schedule; and
- 23 (ii) All license fees shall be paid to the local health department or
- 24 chief financial officer of the county governing body or Baltimore City.
- 25 (2) Except in Baltimore City, Montgomery County, and Prince George's
- 26 County, a license fee under this subsection may not exceed:
