SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is not intended to
affect the benefits allowed from time to time under the State Employee and Retiree
Health and Welfare Benefits Program or the State Retirement and Pension System
for any employee transferred from the State Personnel Management System under
this Act. These employees shall not lose any compensation solely as a result of the
transfer, nor lose any accumulated leave, leave accrual rates, or other benefits.
