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## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Creation of a State Debt - Harford County - The Ripken Stadium

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt not to exceed \$3,875,000,
- 4 the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of the City of
- 5 Aberdeen for certain acquisition, development, or improvement purposes;
- 6 providing for disbursement of the loan proceeds, subject to a requirement that
- 7 the grantee provide and expend a matching fund; and providing generally for
- 8 the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

## 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 10 MARYLAND, That:
- 11 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
- 12 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Harford
- 13 County The Ripken Stadium Loan of 1998 in a total principal amount equal to the
- 14 lesser of (i) \$3,875,000 or (ii) the amount of the matching fund provided in accordance
- 15 with Section 1(5) below. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and
- 16 delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of
- 17 Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8-117 through
- 18 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, § 22 of the Code.
- 19 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as 20 a single issue or may be consolidated and sold as part of a single issue of bonds under
- 21 § 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 22 (3) (a) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the
- 23 Treasurer and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling,
- 24 and delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and
- 25 then shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by
- 26 the Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
- 27 architects' and engineers' fees: as a grant to the Mayor and City Council of the City of
- 28 Aberdeen (referred to hereafter in this Act as "the grantee") for the acquisition of land
- 29 for a new minor league baseball stadium to be located in the City of Aberdeen in
- 30 Harford County, and for the planning, design, construction, and capital equipping of
- 31 the stadium, to be named The Ripken Stadium in honor of the Ripken family, so
- 32 famous and respected in professional baseball and so long associated with the

- 1 Baltimore Orioles, with Cal Ripken, Sr. as manager and coach, Billy Ripken as second
- 2 baseman, and Cal Ripken, Jr. as shortstop and third baseman.
- 3 (b) The site for the new minor league baseball stadium to be acquired
- 4 with the proceeds of the bonds shall be a site other than the 30-acre site north of
- 5 Beards Hill Road and south of Interstate Highway 95 in Aberdeen, known as the
- 6 Jerry Stancill property.
- 7 (4) An annual State tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in
- 8 rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and
- 9 when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years
- 10 after the date of issuance of the bonds.
- 11 (5) (a) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for
- 12 the purposes set forth in Section 1(3) above, the following shall occur:
- 13 (i) The grantee and the County Executive and County Council of
- 14 Harford County shall provide and expend a matching fund. Of the total amount of the
- 15 matching fund, the grantee is responsible for \$1,875,000 and the County Executive
- 16 and County Council of Harford County are responsible for \$2,000,000. No part of the
- 17 matching fund may consist of funds that have been acquired, either directly or
- 18 indirectly, from funds of the State, whether appropriated or unappropriated. No part
- 19 of the matching fund may consist of real property, in kind contributions, or funds
- 20 expended prior to the effective date of this Act. In case of any dispute as to the amount
- 21 of the matching fund or what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the
- 22 Board of Public Works shall determine the matter and the Board's decision is final.
- 23 The grantee and the County Executive and County Council of Harford County have
- 24 until June 1, 1999, to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public Works that
- 25 a matching fund will be provided.
- 26 (ii) The Mayor and City Council of Aberdeen shall have a contract
- 27 with a minor league baseball team to play baseball at the new stadium.
- 28 (b) If satisfactory evidence of a matching fund and of a contract with a
- 29 minor league baseball team is presented, the Board shall certify these facts and the
- 30 amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer, and the proceeds of the loan
- 31 equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided
- 32 in this Act. Any amount of the loan in excess of the amount of the matching fund
- 33 certified by the Board of Public Works shall be canceled and be of no further effect.
- 34 (6) (a) The Mayor and City Council of Aberdeen may enter into an
- 35 agreement with the Maryland Stadium Authority for the planning, design,
- 36 construction, and capital equipping of the new minor league baseball stadium in the
- 37 City of Aberdeen.
- 38 (b) Based on the agreement with the Mayor and City Council of
- 39 Aberdeen for the new minor league baseball stadium in the City of Aberdeen, the
- 40 Maryland Stadium Authority may enter into contracts, engage consultants, make
- 41 recommendations, and take other actions related to the agreement.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 June 1, 1998.
