BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 12 **Article - Labor and Employment** 13 3-413. 14 (A) Except as provided in § 3-414 of this subtitle, each employer shall pay: 15 to each employee who is subject to both the Federal Act and this (1) 16 subtitle, at least the GREATER OF: 17 (I) THE minimum wage for that employee under the Federal Act; 18 [and] OR 19 A WAGE RATE THAT EQUALS \$7.70 PER HOUR BEGINNING IN (II)20 1999 AND \$8.30 BEGINNING IN 2004 AND THEREAFTER; AND 21 (2)each other employee who is subject to this subtitle, at least: 22 (i) the highest minimum wage under the Federal Act; or 23 a training wage under regulations that the Commissioner (ii) 24 adopts that include the conditions and limitations authorized under the federal Fair
