WHEREAS, Since that time, various changes have been made to the General Assembly portion of the Maryland Public Ethics Law; and				
WHEREAS, The need has arisen to make a careful examination of the Maryland Public Ethics Law as it relates to the General Assembly and its members; now, therefore, be it
