- 4 FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor to appoint a special committee to study
- 5 the class size reduction programs in the State and in other states, to review the
- 6 effects and results of past legislative action and individual Local Educational
- Agency initiatives pertaining to this issue, and to propose modifications and
- 8 remedies, as needed; providing for the membership of the committee and the
- 9 appointment of its chairperson; requiring the committee to submit a report to
- the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and
- generally relating to the establishment of a special committee to review issues
- relating to class size in the public schools in the State.
