Task Force to Study the Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher Education Institutions

4 FOR the purpose of providing for the establishment of a Task Force to Study the

5 Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher Education Institutions;

6 providing for the membership of the Task Force; and providing for a report to

7 the Governor and the General Assembly.

8 WHEREAS, A recent mass suicide in California, cult-motivated murders in 9 Mississippi and Florida, and a subway gassing incident in Japan have increased 10 national awareness of the destructive nature of cult activities; and

11 WHEREAS, It has been estimated that there are as many as 2,000 cults

12 operating within the United States with 4 million to 6 million members; and

13 WHEREAS, Cult recruitment activities are often directed towards students on 14 college campuses; and

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1 WHEREAS, College students are particularly vulnerable to cult recruitment

2 because they are often grappling with becoming independent, overwhelmed with new

3 responsibilities and relationships, adjusting to new environments, and anxious about

4 their futures; and

5 WHEREAS, College students who become involved with cults undergo 6 personality changes, suffer academically and financially, are alienated from their 7 families and friends, and are robbed of the very things universities were designed to 8 encourage: freedom of thought, intellectual growth, and personal development; and

9 WHEREAS, Some college administrators have become concerned about cult 10 activities on campus and have taken action to address the situation, but many others 11 have failed to recognize the threat, have refused to deal with the problem, or are 12 searching for policy directions as to how to deal with it; and

13 WHEREAS, Although the United States Constitution and the Maryland

14 Constitution clearly and properly limit the ability of any government entity to

15 interfere with the free exercise of religion by any person or group, the State of

16 Maryland has a right and a responsibility to examine the behaviors of members of any

17 group who violate State or local law or campus policies regarding deception,

18 harassment, or fraud, or who threaten the mental, emotional, or physical well-being

19 of the citizens of Maryland or students enrolled in the University System of 20 Maryland Margan State University and St. Maryla College: new therefore he is

20 Maryland, Morgan State University, and St. Mary's College; now, therefore, be it

21 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That there shall

22 be a Task Force to Study the Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher

23 Education Institutions ; and be it further

24 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall be composed of:

25 (1) Two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of 26 the House;

27 (2) Two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President 28 of the Senate;

29 (3) The Chancellor of the University System of Maryland or the30 Chancellor's designee;

31 <u>(4)</u> <u>The President of the University of Maryland, College Park or the</u> 32 <u>President's designee;</u>

33 (4) (5) The President of St. Mary's College or the President's designee;

34 (5) (6) The President of Morgan State University or the President's

35 designee;

36 (6) (7) A member of the Board of Regents of the University System of
 37 Maryland, appointed by the Governor;

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1(7)(8)A member of the Maryland Higher Education Commission,2 appointed by the Governor;

3 (8) (9) Two parents of current or former cult members, appointed by 4 the Governor; and

5 (10) Two parents representing the parent associations of the constituent 6 institutions; and

7 (9) (11) Two student government representatives from the University
8 System of Maryland, St. Mary's College, or Morgan State University, appointed by the
9 Governor; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the Department of Legislative Services Maryland Higher

11 Education Commission shall Chancellor of the University System of Maryland shall

12 *identify staff from the System office or from a constituent institution to* provide

13 staffing for the Task Force; and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall communicate with and obtain

15 information from cult awareness organizations, former cult members, college

16 administrators, campus security personnel, campus ministers, families of cult

17 members, and other interested parties regarding the recruitment and organizational

18 practices of cults, the extent of cult activities within the University System of

19 Maryland, St. Mary's College, and Morgan State University, the response of college

20 administrators in Maryland and around the nation to cult activities, and the effect of

21 cult involvement on students; and be it further

RESOLVED, That no later than September 30, 1999, the Task Force shall submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, pursuant to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly; and be it further

25 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of

26 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;

27 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; the

28 Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates; the Chancellor of

29 the University System of Maryland; the President of St. Mary's College; and the

30 President of Morgan State University.
