HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

- Task Force to Study the Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher Education Institutions
- 4 FOR the purpose of providing for the establishment of a Task Force to Study the
- 5 Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher Education Institutions;
- 6 providing for the membership of the Task Force; and providing for a report to
- 7 the Governor and the General Assembly.
- 8 WHEREAS, A recent mass suicide in California, cult-motivated murders in
- 9 Mississippi and Florida, and a subway gassing incident in Japan have increased
- 10 national awareness of the destructive nature of cult activities; and
- 11 WHEREAS. It has been estimated that there are as many as 2,000 cults
- 12 operating within the United States with 4 million to 6 million members; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Cult recruitment activities are often directed towards students on
- 14 college campuses; and
- WHEREAS, College students are particularly vulnerable to cult recruitment
- 16 because they are often grappling with becoming independent, overwhelmed with new
- 17 responsibilities and relationships, adjusting to new environments, and anxious about
- 18 their futures; and
- 19 WHEREAS, College students who become involved with cults undergo
- 20 personality changes, suffer academically and financially, are alienated from their
- 21 families and friends, and are robbed of the very things universities were designed to
- 22 encourage: freedom of thought, intellectual growth, and personal development; and

- **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 22** 1 WHEREAS, Some college administrators have become concerned about cult 2 activities on campus and have taken action to address the situation, but many others 3 have failed to recognize the threat, have refused to deal with the problem, or are 4 searching for policy directions as to how to deal with it; and 5 WHEREAS, Although the United States Constitution and the Maryland 6 Constitution clearly and properly limit the ability of any government entity to 7 interfere with the free exercise of religion by any person or group, the State of 8 Maryland has a right and a responsibility to examine the behaviors of members of any 9 group who violate State or local law or campus policies regarding deception. 10 harassment, or fraud, or who threaten the mental, emotional, or physical well-being 11 of the citizens of Maryland or students enrolled in the University System of 12 Maryland, Morgan State University, and St. Mary's College; now, therefore, be it 13 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That there shall 14 be a Task Force to Study the Effects of Cult Activities on Public Senior Higher 15 Education Institutions; and be it further 16 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall be composed of: 17 Two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of (1) 18 the House: 19 Two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President (2)20 of the Senate; (3)The Chancellor of the University System of Maryland or the 22 Chancellor's designee; 23 (4) The President of St. Mary's College or the President's designee; 24 (5) The President of Morgan State University or the President's 25 designee; A member of the Board of Regents of the University System of 26 27 Maryland, appointed by the Governor;
- 28 (7) A member of the Maryland Higher Education Commission, appointed 29 by the Governor;
- 30 (8) Two parents of current or former cult members, appointed by the
- 31 Governor; and
- 32 (9) Two student government representatives from the University System
- 33 of Maryland, St. Mary's College, or Morgan State University, appointed by the
- 34 Governor; and be it further
- 35 RESOLVED, That the Department of Legislative Services Maryland Higher
- 36 Education Commission shall provide staffing for the Task Force; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall communicate with and obtain
- 2 information from cult awareness organizations, former cult members, college
- 3 administrators, campus security personnel, campus ministers, families of cult
- 4 members, and other interested parties regarding the recruitment and organizational
- 5 practices of cults, the extent of cult activities within the University System of
- 6 Maryland, St. Mary's College, and Morgan State University, the response of college
- 7 administrators in Maryland and around the nation to cult activities, and the effect of
- 8 cult involvement on students; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That no later than September 30, 1999, the Task Force shall
- 10 submit its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, pursuant to § 2-1246
- 11 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 13 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 14 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; the
- 15 Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates; the Chancellor of
- 16 the University System of Maryland; the President of St. Mary's College; and the
- 17 President of Morgan State University.
