- 12 WHEREAS, Higher education, and the institutions that provide it, are

University College in certain amounts in certain fiscal years.

- WHEREAS, The international economy, labor market demands for a highly
- 16 skilled and professional work force, and rapid technological change increasingly
- 17 require education beyond high school for both individuals and economies; and
- 18 WHEREAS, It is essential if Maryland is to maintain and improve its
- 19 competitive position in the region and the world, that Maryland's work force continue
- 20 to be upgraded; and
- 21 WHEREAS, There are increasing numbers of nontraditional and part-time
- 22 students in Maryland who require accessible and moderate-cost higher education in
- 23 order to meet the work force demands of a changing economy; and
- 24 WHEREAS, University College, one of the constituent institutions in the
- 25 University System of Maryland, serves a unique role by providing a variety of
- 26 educational programs, including scientific, technical, and management programs, to

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- 1 enhance students' career development while providing Maryland employers a more
- 2 skilled and productive work force; and
- 3 WHEREAS, There are 14,000 students attending University College programs
- 4 in Maryland who pay the highest undergraduate tuition among the State's public
- 5 institutions and two to three times the tuition charged by Maryland community
- 6 colleges; and
- WHEREAS, Because of the State's severe economic downturn in 1992, the State
- 8 eliminated its funding commitment to help offset the relatively high cost of tuition at
- 9 University College; and
- WHEREAS, The State's economy has improved significantly since State
- 11 assistance to University College was eliminated; now, therefore,
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 27 (2) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2001, AN AMOUNT
- 28 EQUAL TO 12 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 29 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 30 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;
- 31 (3) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2002, AN AMOUNT
- 32 EQUAL TO 14 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 33 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 34 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR:
- 35 (4) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2003, AN AMOUNT
- 36 EQUAL TO 16 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 37 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 38 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;

- 1 (5) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2004, AN AMOUNT
- 2 EQUAL TO 18 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 3 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 4 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR; AND
- 5 (6) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2005, AND FOR
- 6 SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEARS, AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO 20 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S
- 7 GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE
- 8 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE
