- 12 \$2,500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR BOTH.
- 13 (b) An officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take into custody a
- 14 person whom the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of an ex parte
- 15 order or protective order in effect at the time of the violation.
