- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 (a) A person who fails to comply with the relief granted in an exparte order
- 16 under § 4-505(a)(2)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) of this subtitle or in a protective order
- 17 under § 4-506(d)(1), (2), (3), (4), or (5) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 18 on conviction is subject, for each offense, to a fine not exceeding \$500 or imprisonment
- 19 not exceeding [90 days] 3 YEARS or both.
- 20 (b) An officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take into custody a
- 21 person whom the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of an ex parte
- 22 order or protective order in effect at the time of the violation.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 October 1, 1998.
