4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the financing of intangible assets as part of the local

- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 83B - Department of Housing and Community Development

2 2-201.

3 (a) It is found and declared that in this era of rapid population growth and 4 expansion and of increasing urbanization, there is a need, in many areas of the State, 5 to promote sound community development.

6 It is further found and declared that the counties and municipalities of the State 7 do not have adequate resources to, and the ordinary operations of private enterprise 8 cannot without State assistance, deal effectively with all of the problems of sound 9 community development.

It is further found that a need exists to coordinate and concentrate federal,
State, regional and local public and private community development efforts and
resources.

13 It is further found and declared that there is a shortage of adequate, safe, and 14 sanitary housing for families of limited income particularly; and that by increasing 15 the housing supply for families of limited incomes this shortage will be alleviated and 16 sound community development promoted.

17 It is further found and declared that the increase of opportunities for18 homeownership is desirable and promotes sound community development.

19 It is further found and declared that the reduction of the consumption of energy 20 and the increase in the utilization of solar energy by the provision of financial 21 assistance to encourage energy conservation and solar energy improvements to 22 housing and buildings used for commercial purposes promotes sound community 23 development and is otherwise in the public interest.

It is further found and declared that the public infrastructure maintained by local government[, which includes streets, sidewalks, curbs, sewer and water systems, bridges, and public buildings,] is in need of IMPROVEMENT, rehabilitation [and], OR construction, that the resources necessary for financing infrastructure projects [have become scarcer in recent years] ARE LIMITED, and that providing an additional, accessible, and uncomplicated mechanism for financing infrastructure needs promotes sound community development, is vital to a strong economy, improves the quality of the environment, and otherwise promotes the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the State.

It is further found and declared that to promote sound community development is a proper public purpose and State use for which public money may be expended and property may be acquired, and that the functions and responsibilities of the Community Development Administration as hereinafter set forth are necessary and proper for the purpose of achieving the ends here recited.

39 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

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1 (o) "Infrastructure project" means any undertaking, project, or facility that is

2 planned, acquired, owned, developed, constructed, reconstructed, rehabilitated, or

3 improved by or on behalf of a county or municipality in order to provide the essential

4 [physical] elements that constitute the basis of the public service system[.

5 Infrastructure projects include, but are not limited to, streets, sidewalks, curbs, sewer

6 and water systems, bridges, and public buildings] AND that are owned by a county or

7 municipality or any of their agencies or instrumentalities. Infrastructure projects

8 may not include any facilities with respect to which local obligations financing such

9 facilities would be private activity bonds within the meaning of § 141 of the Internal

10 Revenue Code, for which an allocation under § 146 of the Internal Revenue Code

11 would be required.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 13 effect July 1, 1998.
