1 AN ACT concerning

2 Special Police Officers

- 3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that the commission of a special police officer may be
- 4 suspended; authorizing the Governor to delegate to the Secretary of State or
- 5 Assistant Secretary of State the authority to revoke or suspend a commission of
- a special police officer; providing that under certain circumstances a commission
- of a special police officer does not terminate when an employer no longer needs
- 8 the special police officer's services; <u>requiring a special police officer to surrender</u>
- 9 certain identification or a certain badge within a certain period of time after
- 10 <u>termination or suspension of the officer's employment or commission;</u> making
- stylistic changes; and generally relating to special police officers.

- 14 Section 4-901, 4-905, 4-907, 4-909, 4-912, and 4-913

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

2 4-901.

- The Governor may appoint and deputize as special [policemen] POLICE
- 4 OFFICERS persons [he] THE GOVERNOR deems qualified for special police
- 5 commissions. A commission shall be issued for each individual approved by the
- 6 Governor. The commission shall indicate the period the commission is to be in force as
- 7 well as the property it is intended to cover or the purpose for which it was issued.
- 8 4-905.
- 9 Each person appointed under this subtitle as a special [policeman] POLICE
- 10 OFFICER is charged with the protection and preservation of peace and good order on
- 11 the property described in the application for the commission. [He] THE OFFICER has
- 12 the power to arrest persons who trespass or commit offenses thereon. [He] THE
- 13 OFFICER has, and may exercise, the powers of a police officer upon the property
- 14 described in the application for the commission and may exercise these powers in any
- 15 county or city of the State in connection with the care, custody, and protection of other
- 16 property of the requesting authority or other property, real or personal, for which it
- 17 has assumed an obligation to maintain or protect. In order to facilitate the orderly
- 18 ingress and egress of traffic to and from the property described in the application,
- 19 [he] THE OFFICER has authority to direct and control traffic on public highways and
- 20 roads adjacent to and in the immediate vicinity of the property described in the
- 21 application when this activity is approved in advance by the Secretary of the State
- 22 Police; however, only a special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER with a probationary or
- 23 permanent appointment as a security officer or a member of any industrial police
- 24 force who holds a special police commission, and has completed the basic training
- 25 course for police officers as established by the Police Training Commission, pursuant
- 26 to § 4-201 of this article may make arrests or issue traffic citations for violations of
- 27 any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law or any other State or local traffic
- 28 laws or regulations. [He] THE OFFICER may exercise this power only upon the
- 29 property of [his] THE OFFICER'S employer as described in the application for the
- 30 commission unless [he] THE OFFICER is in active pursuit of an individual for the
- 31 purpose of immediate apprehension. [He] THE OFFICER is responsible for any abuse
- 32 of [his] THE OFFICER'S powers or the exercise of them on property not within [his]
- 33 THE OFFICER'S jurisdiction. The requesting authority for whose convenience and
- 34 protection the [policeman] THE OFFICER has been appointed is also responsible for
- 35 any wrongful actions committed by [him] THE OFFICER in the course of [his] THE
- 36 OFFICER'S duties as well as any abuse of the powers granted by the commission
- 37 either on or off the premises.

- 39 (a) Every special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER shall wear a distinctive police
- 40 badge which shall carry proper identification identifying [him] THE OFFICER as a
- 41 special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER and be in plain view to all who come in contact
- 42 with [him] THE OFFICER. The [policeman] POLICE OFFICER shall also wear a
- 43 uniform which shall be distinguishable from ordinary civilian clothing and give some

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- 1 notice of [his] THE OFFICER'S designation as a law-enforcement official. The uniform
- 2 and badge and identification shall be subject to the acceptance or refusal by the
- 3 Department of State Police. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to a
- 4 special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER when on detective duty.
- 5 (b) Every special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER on detective duty shall carry
- 6 proper identification identifying [him] THE OFFICER as a special [policeman]
- 7 POLICE OFFICER and shall also carry a distinctive police badge as referred to in
- 8 subsection (a) above.
- 9 (C) A SPECIAL POLICE OFFICER WHO RECEIVES A COMMISSION UNDER THIS
- 10 SUBTITLE SHALL SURRENDER TO THE OFFICER'S EMPLOYER ANY IDENTIFICATION
- 11 OR BADGE THAT IDENTIFIES THE INDIVIDUAL AS A SPECIAL POLICE OFFICER
- 12 WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER:
- 13 <u>(1) THE TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION OF THE EMPLOYMENT OF THE</u>
- 14 SPECIAL POLICE OFFICER; OR
- 15 (2) THE TERMINATION OR SUSPENSION OF A COMMISSION OF THE
- 16 SPECIAL POLICE OFFICER AS PROVIDED UNDER § 4-913(A) OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 17 4-909.
- Each person appointed under this subtitle shall be deemed to be the employee of
- 19 the State, agency, governing body, school system, or business concern requesting
- 20 [his] THE OFFICER'S appointment. [He] THE OFFICER shall be compensated by it on
- 21 whatever terms contracted for.
- 22 4-912.
- 23 Unless a subdivision or municipality requests the appointment of an individual
- 24 as a special [policeman] POLICE OFFICER and the request is granted as provided in
- 25 this subtitle, the State and any subdivision or municipality of the State shall have the
- 26 immunity from liability described under § 5-613 of the Courts and Judicial
- 27 Proceedings Article.
- 28 4-913.
- 29 (A) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE
- 30 commissions granted under this subtitle shall cease OR BE SUSPENDED upon the
- 31 filing of a notice in writing by the State, agency, college, school system, or business
- 32 which requested the appointment, stating that the [policeman is no longer required
- 33 and OFFICER has been relieved of [his] OR SUSPENDED FROM THE OFFICER'S
- 34 duties. The Governor, upon recommendation by the Secretary of the State Police, or
- 35 on the Governor's own motion if the Governor finds it in the best interest of the State,
- 36 may terminate OR SUSPEND any commission granted under this subtitle. The
- 37 termination OR SUSPENSION shall be noted in the official records of the Governor and
- 38 shall not be effective until five days after notice is sent to the requesting State,
- 39 agency, school, or business and also to the person whose commission has been revoked
- 40 OR SUSPENDED. If that person thereafter, knowing of the revocation OR SUSPENSION

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- 1 or having in any manner received notice thereof, exercises or attempts to exercise any
- 2 of the powers granted under this subtitle, that person shall be guilty of a
- 3 misdemeanor; and upon conviction be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for
- 4 not more than six months, or both. The filing and mailing of notice as indicated above
- 5 shall raise a presumption that the person knew of the revocation OR SUSPENSION.
- 6 (B) THE GOVERNOR MAY DELEGATE THE POWER TO TERMINATE OR SUSPEND
- 7 A COMMISSION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE, THE
- 8 ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE, OR BOTH.
- 9 (C) A COMMISSION GRANTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT TERMINATE 10 IF:
- 11 (1) AN EMPLOYER NO LONGER NEEDS THE SERVICES OF THE SPECIAL
- 12 POLICE OFFICER BECAUSE THE EMPLOYER HAS TRANSFERRED THE BUSINESS
- 13 PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE COMMISSION TO ANOTHER PERSON FOR LEGITIMATE
- 14 AND LEGAL BUSINESS PURPOSES; AND
- 15 (2) THE TRANSFEREE EXECUTES A FORM PREPARED BY THE SECRETARY
- 16 OF STATE AFFIRMING THAT THE TRANSFEREE WILL EMPLOY THE SPECIAL POLICE
- 17 OFFICER TO PROTECT THAT BUSINESS PROPERTY, AND WILL ASSUME ALL
- 18 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ORIGINAL APPLICANT EMPLOYER UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 20 effect October 1, 1998.
