CHAPTER $\qquad$
1 AN ACT concerning

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4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration to issue specially designed animal friendly commemorative registration plates to enhance publie awareness of the State's commitment to manage the population of dogs and cats through sterilization and to subsidize the efforts of certain entities that humanely sterilize dogs and eats in the State; requiring the Governor to appoint a certain number of individuals to a committee to develop, organize, and implement a statewide contest to design the commemorative plates; restricting the issuance of the commemorative plates to certain classes of vehicles; requiring the Administration to charge an additional registration fee for the commemorative plates under certain circumstances; requiring the Administration to transfer a certain portion of the additional registration fee eharged for commemorative plates isstued under this Act to certain counties monthly; requiring counties receiving funds under this Act either to distribute

1 the funds received in a certain manner to certain entities or to return the funds

> to the Administration; providing for the allocation of funds returned by a county to the Administration Governor to appoint a committee to design an emblem or logo for use on organizational license plates by animal humane societies or similar organizations for specified purposes; specifying the membership of the committee; authorizing the committee to solicit suggestions from certain groups; providing that the final design is subject to the approval of the Motor Vehicle Administration; specifying legislative intent concerning use of the emblem or logo; clarifying that certain fees might be charged by eligible organizations and that the fees are intended for certain purposes; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act; and generally relating to the issuance of commemorative organizational registration plates by the Administration relating to the management of the population of dogs and cats.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article-Transportation

13618.1.
(A) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ISSUE SPECIAL COMMEMORATIVE ORIGINAL OR SUBSTITUTE REGISTRATION PLATES TO:
(1) ENHANCE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE STATE'S COMMITMENT TO MANAGE THE POPULATION OF DOGS AND CATS THROUGH STERHIZATION; AND
(2) SUBSIDIZE THE EFFORTS OF ENTITIES THAT HUMANELY STERILIZE

## DOGS AND CATS.

(B) THE OWNER OF A VEHHCLE, OR A LESSEE OF THE VEHHCLE UNDER A LEASE NOT INTENDED AS SECURITY, OR A DIRECTOR, OFFICER, EMPLOYEE, OR PARTNER OF A BUSINESS ENTITY THAT OWNS THE VEHCLE CONSIDERED ELIGBLE BY THE ADMINISTRATION MAY APPLY TO THE ADMINISTRATION FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF A COMMEMORATIVE REGISTRATION PLATE UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE VEHICLE IS INCLUDED IN ONE OF THE FOLLOWING CLASSES:
(1) ACLASS $A$ (PASSENGER) VEHICLE;
(2) A CLASS B (FOR HIRE) VEHCLE;
(3) ACLASS E (TRUCK) VEHICLE WITH A MANUFACTURER'S RATED

CAPACITY OF 1 TON OR LESS;

(C) (1) IN ADDITION TO THE ANNUAL REGISTRATION FEE OTHERWISE

REQUIRED UNDER THIS TITLE, AN OWNER OF A VEHICLE ASSIGNED A
SET BY THE ADMINISTRATION WHEN THE NEW REGISTRATION PLATES ARE ISSUED TO THE VEHICLE UNDER THIS SECTION.

## (2) (I) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL SET THE FEE AT A LEVEL THAT

(ШШ) THE ADMINHSTRATION SHALL RETAIN A PORTION OF THE FEE THAT IS SUFFICIENT TO ALLOW THE ADMINISTRATION TO RECOVER ANY COSTS OF ISSUING AND DISTRIBUTING COMMEMORATIVE PLATES UNDER THIS SECTION.
(IV) ANY SURPLUS MONEYS REMAINING AFTER THE ADMINISTRATION HAS RECOVERED THE COSTS OF ISSUING A COMMEMORATIVE PLATE UNDER THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE RETAINED BY OR TRANSFERRED TO ANY AGENCY OF THE STATE FOR ANY PURPOSE.
(V) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBPARAGRAPH (IV) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE SURPLUS MONEYS MAY BE RETAINED FOR THE PURPOSE DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
(3) THE SURPLUS MONEYS SHALL BE DISBURSED BY THE ADMINISTRATION TO EACH COUNTY MONTHLY IN A PROPORTIONATE SHARE EQUAL TO THE PERCENTAGE OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF REGISTRATION PLATES ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION THAT ARE ISSUED TO RESIDENTS OF THE RESPECTIVE COUNTY.
(4) EACH COUNTY RECEIVING FUNDS UNDER THS SECTION SHALL:
( $)$ DISTRIBUTE THE ENTIRETY OF THE FUNDS PROMPTLY TO ENTITIES THAT HUMANELY STERHLZE DOGS AND CATS WITHIN THAT COUNTY; OR
(\#) RETURN THE ENTIRETY OF THE FUNDS PROMPTLY TOTHE ADMINISTRATION.
(5) FUNDS RECEIVED BY A COUNTY UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL BE APPLIED IN ADDITION TO AND NOT IN SUBSTITUTION OF EXISTING FUNDING BY THE COUNTY OF ENTITIES THAT HUMANELY STERHIZE DOGS AND CATS. 7 MOTOR VEHICLE REVENUE ACCOUNT FOR DISTRIBUTION UNDER § 8-403 OR § 8-404 8 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.

14 (2) The final design of an emblem or logo is subject to the approval of the 15 Motor Vehicle Administration.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
17 General Assembly that, following adoption of an emblem or logo under Section 1 of this
18 Act, any animal humane society or similar organization may apply to the Motor
19 Vehicle Administration under § 13-619 of the Transportation Article and regulations
20 of the Motor Vehicle Administration for an organizational license plate, using the
21 emblem or logo adopted under Section 1 of this Act in combination with the name of
22 the organization or an appropriate slogan approved by the Administration that relates
23 to the issue of dog and cat population management. An animal humane society or
24 similar organization that obtains an organizational license plate using the emblem or
25 logo adopted under Section 1 of this Act may collect a fee set by the organization from
26 any person seeking an organizational registration plate through the organization. The
27 fee is intended to be for the purpose of humanely sterilizing dogs and cats and is in
28 addition to any fee collected by the Motor Vehicle Administration under § 13-619 of the
29 Transportation Article. The fee is to be collected directly by the organization and not
30 the Motor Vehicle Administration.
31 SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 32 effect October 1, 1998. It Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of $z$ 33 years 9 months and, at the end of September 30, 2000 June 30, 1999, with no further
34 action required by the General Assembly, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and
35 of no further force and effect.
