- 23 administrator as required by this title shall pay a penalty equal to [25] 15 percent of
- 24 the value of the property. If any person fails to file any report or refuses to deliver
- 25 property to the administrator as required by this title, the administrator may bring
- 26 an action in a court of appropriate jurisdiction to require the filing of the report and
- 27 to enforce delivery of the property.
