A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Registers of Wills - Salary**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the maximum salary that the Board of Public Works may  
4 set for a register of wills of a county; and providing that this Act does not apply  
5 to the salary or compensation of an incumbent clerk.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Estates and Trusts**

19 2-205.

20 (a) (1) It is the intent of this section that each register shall receive a fair  
21 and adequate compensation for the effort and duties required of the register by the  
22 register's office.

23 (2) The volume and character of work done by the register shall be in  
24 comparison to the salary fixed by the Board of Public Works for each of the other  
25 registers.

1 (b) (1) Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary of not less than  
2 \$6,000 and not more than [\$64,000] \$75,000, to be determined in each instance by the  
3 Board of Public Works.

4 (2) In determining the annual salary of the register, the Board of Public  
5 Works shall be guided in the exercise of its discretion by:

6 (i) The population of the county determined by the last official  
7 United States census;

8 (ii) The dollar volume of total fees and taxes collected and excess  
9 fees turned over to the State for each of the preceding 5 years by the office of the  
10 register for which the salary is being fixed; and

11 (iii) Other pertinent data which have relation to the reasonableness  
12 of the salary in relation to the work done and volume handled by the office.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III,  
14 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or  
15 apply to the salary or compensation of the clerk of each circuit court in office on the  
16 effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the salary or  
17 compensation of the clerk of each circuit court shall take effect at the beginning of the  
18 next following term of office.

19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
20 October 1, 1998.
