Health Occupation Boards - Study of Codes of Conduct for Board Members and Investigators

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the health occupation boards and the Department of

5 Health and Mental Hygiene to study the recommendations of a certain report

6 concerning the establishment of certain codes of conduct and determine how to

7 implement those recommendations in a specified manner; requiring each health

8 occupation board to identify certain changes to its statutory authority; requiring

9 the health occupation boards and the Department of Health and Mental

10 Hygiene to report to certain committees of the General Assembly by a certain

11 date; providing for the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to the

12 study of the establishment of codes of conduct for health occupation board

13 members and investigators.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That each health occupation board and the Department of Health and

16 Mental Hygiene shall study the recommendations of the August 25, 1997 report of the

17 Executive Director of the State Ethics Commission concerning the establishment of

18 codes of conduct for members of health occupation boards and the investigators

19 assigned to those boards and determine how to implement those recommendations

20 with as much uniformity among the health occupation boards as practicable. In

21 addition, each health occupation board shall identify the changes to its statutory

22 authority that would be necessary to establish and enforce a code of conduct. The

23 health occupation boards and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall

24 report to the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House

25 Environmental Matters Committee on or before November 1, 1998, in accordance 26 with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, with the conclusions of their study.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 June 1, 1998.
