14	WHEREAS, There is a need for an effective comprehensive urban community college in Baltimore City offering educational programs that will stimulate the participation of individuals, be responsive to the needs of the community, and prepare individuals to be qualified participants in the region's economy; and
	WHEREAS, The Maryland General Assembly in 1990 made a commitment to provide an adequate level of funding to Baltimore City Community College to correct a history of underfunding at the college; and
	WHEREAS, Baltimore City Community College is the only Maryland public community college not affected by the funding mechanism enacted for the other seventeen community colleges in 1996; now, therefore,
