8	WHEREAS, The Department of Business and Economic Development and key members of the business community report that Maryland's businesses are experiencing a shortage, or anticipate a shortage, of qualified applicants in the fields of computer science, engineering, and technology; and
	WHEREAS, A Maryland Higher Education Commission survey of over 2,500 employers in all regions of the State indicates that additional workers are needed in these critical areas; and
13 14	WHEREAS, These fields of science and technology are among the highest growth industries for the 21st Century; and
	WHEREAS, An educated, well trained and highly skilled workforce is crucial to economic development and job growth in this State as higher education and business needs are closely linked; and

SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 24 25 SUBSECTION, EACH RECIPIENT OF A MARYLAND SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY 26 SCHOLARSHIP WHO IS ENROLLED IN A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM MAY 27 RENEW THE ANNUAL AWARD FOUR TIMES IF THE RECIPIENT IS ENROLLED IN AN 28 UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC PROGRAM THAT, AS DETERMINED BY THE 29 INSTITUTION, REQUIRES 5 YEARS TO COMPLETE.
