FOR the purpose of providing that a Maryland State flag shall be issued to the family of any sworn member of the State Fire Marshal's Office who was killed in the line of duty; providing that the flag shall be presented by the State Senator of the legislative district in which the deceased <i>resided or</i> served; altering a similar provision relating to deceased firefighters to provide for presentation by the State Senator of the legislative district in which the firefighter <i>resided or</i> served; and generally relating to the State Fire Marshal's Office.
