Those designated persons shall submit to the Department validated 12 listings naming all persons who have successfully completed the course of instruction. 13 The Department shall issue a certificate of competency and safety to 14 each person who successfully completes the course of instruction, and the certificate 15 shall be valid until revoked by the Department. 16 The Department may not issue a certificate of competency and safety 17 to an individual under the age of 18 unless the individual has completed satisfactorily 18 the course of instruction, or produces a certificate of competency or a hunting license 19 issued prior to July 1, 1978 or makes out an affidavit that the individual had such a 20 license. 21 (c) The Department shall institute and coordinate a statewide course of 22 instruction in conservation and in competency and safety in the handling of firearms, 23 and in so doing, the Department may cooperate with any political subdivision or with 24 any reputable organization having as 1 of its objectives the promotion of competency 25 and safety in the handling of firearms, such as the National Rifle Association and 26 local rod and gun clubs. 27 The Department may conduct the course in hunter safety and issue (2) 28 the certificates, using Department personnel or other persons at times and in areas 29 where other competent agencies are unable or unwilling to meet the demand for 30 instruction. Any similar certificate, or hunting license, issued outside the State 31 (3) 32 by a governmental agency, shall be accepted as complying with the requirements of 33 paragraph (1) of the subsection, if the privileges are reciprocal for Maryland 34 residents.
