8 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Four  
9 ~~Hundred Nineteen Million, Eight Hundred Twenty Four~~ ~~Seven Million, One~~  
10 ~~Hundred Two~~ ~~Four Million, Two Hundred Sixty Seven~~ **Five Million, Seven**  
11 **Hundred Sixteen** Thousand Dollars (~~\$419,824,000~~) (~~\$407,102,000~~)  
12 (~~\$404,267,000~~) (**\$405,716,000**), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary  
13 building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion,  
14 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, and for acquiring  
15 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain  
16 subdivisions and other organizations for certain purposes, subject to the  
17 requirement that certain grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain

1 type by a certain date; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds  
2 evidencing the loan; providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior  
3 Capital Budgets and Bond Acts to be expended for other public projects; altering  
4 certain requirements for certain programs in prior Capital Budgets; providing  
5 that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior Capital Budgets and Bond  
6 Acts be reduced by certain amounts; authorizing the Maryland Stadium  
7 Authority to perform certain construction related activities, subject to certain  
8 notification requirements of the General Assembly; and generally relating to the  
9 financing of certain capital projects.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
 5 MARYLAND, That:

6 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on  
 7 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland  
 8 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1998 in the total principal amount of ~~\$419,824,000~~  
 9 ~~\$407,102,000~~ ~~\$404,267,000~~ **\$405,716,000**. This loan shall be evidenced by the  
 10 issuance, sale, and delivery of State general obligation bonds authorized by a  
 11 resolution of the Board of Public Works and issued, sold, and delivered in accordance  
 12 with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the State Finance and Procurement Article and  
 13 Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

14 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as  
 15 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement  
 16 Article.

17 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer  
 18 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and  
 19 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then  
 20 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the  
 21 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable  
 22 architects' and engineers' fees:
