- 7 provided that prior to beginning work on behalf of a State agency or local government,
- 8 the Authority must notify the budget committees in writing of the proposed project
- 9 and allow the committees 30 days to review and comment on the proposed work. The
- 10 Authority is permitted to enter into contracts, engage consultants, and make
- 11 recommendations relating to this purpose and shall use funds provided by the State
- 12 agencies or local governments or otherwise appropriated for the particular purpose.

13 SECTION 12. 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to

14 be authorized by legislation in Fiscal Year 1999 shall not exceed \$430,000,000, as
