A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt - Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of**
3 **1998, Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 1990, 1991, 1993, 1994,**
4 **1995, 1996, and 1997, General Construction Loans of 1985 and 1986, and**
5 **Academic Facilities Bonding Authority of 1997**

6 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Four
7 Hundred Nineteen Million, Eight Hundred Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars
8 (\$419,824,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building,
9 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and
10 capital equipment purchases of this State, and for acquiring certain real estate
11 in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other
12 organizations for certain purposes, subject to the requirement that certain
13 grantees provide certain matching funds of a certain type by a certain date;
14 providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan;
15 providing for certain unexpended appropriations in prior Capital Budgets and
16 Bond Acts to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements
17 for certain programs in prior Capital Budgets; providing that the authorizations
18 of State Debt in certain prior Capital Budgets and Bond Acts be reduced by
19 certain amounts; and generally relating to the financing of certain capital
20 projects.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 14 MARYLAND, That:

15 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
 16 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
 17 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1998 in the total principal amount of
 18 \$419,824,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
 19 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
 20 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the
 21 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

22 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as
 23 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement
 24 Article.

25 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer
 26 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and
 27 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then
 28 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the
 29 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable
 30 architects' and engineers' fees:

26 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the
 27 Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions of
 28 this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the
 29 Construction Contingency Fund under Section 3-609 of the State Finance and
 30 Procurement Article.

31 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are
 32 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or
 33 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper
 34 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds
 35 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board
 36 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal
 37 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in
 38 this Act, and not to expand its scope.

39 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for any appropriation for
 40 planning of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if a program required by
 41 Section 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article has not been
 42 submitted, then the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall

1 submit a program to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before
 2 funds may be expended from the appropriation. For any appropriation for
 3 construction of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and
 4 outline specifications required by Section 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and
 5 Procurement Article have not been prepared, then the State agency or institution
 6 responsible for the project shall submit preliminary plans and outline specifications
 7 to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be
 8 expended from the appropriation.

9 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That no portion of the
 10 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under
 11 this Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in
 12 connection with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building
 13 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in
 14 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious
 15 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the
 16 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that
 17 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for
 18 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

19 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

20 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any
 21 other loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation loan enabling
 22 act, under the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued, for any
 23 expenditure authorized by such Act.

24 (b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may
 25 advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation
 26 loan enabling act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the
 27 Board, for any expenditure authorized by the Act, provided that the next sale of
 28 general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of
 29 that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.

30 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be
 31 authorized by legislation in Fiscal Year 1999 shall not exceed \$430,000,000, as
 32 evidenced by the following:

32 SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
33 June 1, 1998.
