- 28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation** 2 16-402. 3 After the conviction of an individual for a violation of Article 27, § 388, § (a) 4 388A, or § 388B of the Code, or of the vehicle laws or regulations of this State or of any 5 local authority, points shall be assessed against the individual as of the date of 6 violation and as follows: Failing to stop for a school vehicle with alternately flashing 7 (5)8 RED WARNING lights 2 points 9 21-101. 10 (f) "Crosswalk" means[: 11 (1) Any marked crosswalk, as defined in this section; or 12 That THAT part of a roadway that is within the prolongation or (2) 13 connection of the lateral lines of sidewalks at any place where 2 or more roadways of 14 any type meet or join, measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the 15 edges of the roadway. 16 [(h-1) (1)]"Marked crosswalk" means any part of a roadway that is distinctly 17 indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines and markings as provided in paragraphs (2) 18 and (3) of this subsection. 19 Except as provided in paragraph (3), the markings indicating a 20 marked crosswalk at a traffic light, shall consist of two parallel solid white lines 21 marking both edges of the crosswalk. These lines shall be at least six inches wide and 22 at least six feet apart. However, in an area where the speed limit is more than 35 23 miles an hour, or where a crosswalk is located at other than an intersection, or where 24 the existence of a crosswalk is unexpected, or where a crosswalk is located in a school 25 zone, these lines may be increased to a width of 24 inches, and the space between 26 them shall be hatched with diagonal white lines that are 12 to 24 inches wide and 12 27 to 24 inches apart. 28 The markings indicating a marked crosswalk at an intersection 29 without a traffic light shall consist of two parallel solid white lines marking both 30 edges of the crosswalk. These lines shall be: 31 12 to 24 inches wide, and the space between them shall be 32 hatched with diagonal or longitudinal white lines that are 12 to 24 inches wide and 12 33 to 24 inches apart in an area where: 34 1. The speed limit is more than 35 miles an hour; 2. A crosswalk is located at other than an intersection; 35 3. 36 The existence of a crosswalk is unexpected; or
