- 12 WHEREAS, William H. Amoss was first elected to the House of Delegates in
- 13 1974 and to the Senate of Maryland in 1982; and
- WHEREAS, During his 23-year tenure as a member of the Maryland General
- 15 Assembly, Senator Amoss championed efforts to assure the provision of adequate fire
- 16 and rescue services to the citizens of Maryland; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Senator Amoss was instrumental in establishing the State Fire,
- 18 Rescue, and Ambulance Fund in 1985 to provide State assistance for local and
- 19 volunteer fire, rescue, and ambulance companies for the acquisition of fire and
- 20 emergency vehicles and equipment; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Since that time, Senator Amoss worked countless hours with fire
- 22 and emergency services officials, fellow legislators, and the Chief Executives of the
- 23 State to increase funding and revise the aid formula to address the growing demands
- 24 placed on local and volunteer fire, rescue, and ambulance companies; and
