- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article 83A Department of Business and Economic Development
- 14 5-403.
- 15 (a) The Secretary may not designate any area an enterprise zone unless that 16 area satisfies at least one of the following requirements:
- 17 (1) The average rate of unemployment in the area, or within a
- 18 reasonable proximity within that county to that area, for the most recent 18-month
- 19 period for which data are available must be at least 150 percent of the average rate of
- 20 unemployment in either the State of Maryland or the United States, whichever
- 21 average rate is greater, during that same period;
- 22 (2) The population in the area or within a reasonable proximity within
- 23 that county to that area is a low-income poverty area on the basis of the most recent
- 24 census OR OTHER BASIS SATISFACTORY TO THE SECRETARY;
- 25 (3) At least 70 percent of the families living in the area or within a
- 26 reasonable proximity within that county to that area have incomes that are less than
- 27 an amount equal to 80 percent of the median family income within the political
- 28 subdivision in which the area is located; or

- 1 (4) Population in the area or within a reasonable proximity within that 2 county to that area decreased by 10 percent between the date of the most recent
- 3 census and the date of the immediately preceding census, and the political
- 4 subdivision can demonstrate to the Secretary's satisfaction that either chronic
- 5 abandonment or demolition of property is occurring in that area or substantial
- 6 property tax arrearages exist within that area.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 8 October 1, 1998.
