CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Board of License Commissioners - Personnel**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing certain provisions of law for Baltimore City concerning
4 the determination of salaries of personnel of the Board of License
5 Commissioners; authorizing certain personnel to be part of the classified civil
6 service of Baltimore City; establishing the position of Administrative
7 Coordinator, which shall be part of the classified civil service of Baltimore City;
8 requiring the Board of License Commissioners to determine the salaries of
9 certain employees; establishing a schedule of salary grade levels for certain
10 employees of the Board; and generally relating to the Board of License
11 Commissioners for Baltimore City.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

6 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

7 15-112.

8 (d) (1) This subsection applies only in Baltimore City.

9 (9) (i) 1. In this paragraph, "inspectors" means full-time
10 inspectors who are employees of the Board. "Inspectors" does not include an inspector
11 supervisor or assistant inspector supervisor.

12 2. Inspectors who were appointed prior to October 1, 1997,
13 shall continue their appointment after that date unless removed in accordance with
14 classified civil service procedures.

15 (ii) As of October 1, 1997:

16 1. Inspectors are part of the classified civil service of the
17 City;

18 2. The Board may appoint and remove inspectors only in
19 accordance with the provisions of law that govern classified civil service employees of
20 the City;

21 3. An employee of the Board may not solicit or receive,
22 directly or indirectly or on behalf of another person, a commission, political
23 contribution, remuneration, or gift from:

24 A. A licensee or other person who is engaged in the
25 manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages; or

26 B. An agent or employee of a licensee or other person who is
27 engaged in the manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages; and

28 4. An employee or other person specified in
29 sub-subparagraph 3 of this subparagraph who violates the provisions of that
30 sub-subparagraph is subject to the penalties specified in § 16-503 of this article.

31 (iii) The provisions of this paragraph do not alter the process by
32 which inspectors' salaries are funded. [Salaries shall be determined by the City
33 Department of Personnel under the compensation policies for classified employees of
34 the Board. The Department shall ensure that salaries for the positions of Inspector I
35 and Inspector II are comparable to similar positions elsewhere in the City
36 government.]

1 (iv) The inspector supervisor and assistant inspector supervisor
2 shall be residents of Baltimore City.

3 (V) THE INSPECTOR SUPERVISOR, ASSISTANT INSPECTOR
4 SUPERVISOR, OFFICE ASSISTANT, ACCOUNTING ASSISTANT, SECRETARY III, OFFICE
5 SUPERVISOR, AND APPLICATIONS INVESTIGATOR APPOINTED PRIOR TO OCTOBER 1,
6 1998 SHALL CONTINUE THEIR APPOINTMENT AFTER THAT DATE UNLESS REMOVED
7 IN ACCORDANCE WITH CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE PROCEDURES.

8 (VI) AS OF OCTOBER 1, 1998:

9 1. THE INSPECTOR SUPERVISOR, ASSISTANT INSPECTOR
10 SUPERVISOR, OFFICE ASSISTANT, ACCOUNTING ASSISTANT, SECRETARY III, AND
11 OFFICE SUPERVISOR ARE PART OF THE CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE OF BALTIMORE
12 CITY.

13 2. THERE SHALL BE AN ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR
14 WHICH POSITION SHALL REPLACE THE POSITION OF APPLICATIONS INVESTIGATOR.
15 THE ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR SHALL BE PART OF THE CLASSIFIED CIVIL
16 SERVICE OF BALTIMORE CITY.

17 (10) (I) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS
18 PARAGRAPH, THE SALARIES OF EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD SHALL BE DETERMINED
19 BY THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE
20 SENATORS FROM BALTIMORE CITY.

21 (II) THE BOARD MAY CONSIDER AN EMPLOYEE'S LENGTH OF
22 SERVICE IN DETERMINING THE APPROPRIATE SALARY LEVEL.

23 ~~(10)~~ (11) THE FOLLOWING IS THE SCHEDULE OF CITY UNION OF
24 BALTIMORE (CUB) SALARY GRADE LEVELS FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD:

25 (I) OFFICE ASSISTANT - GRADE 082;

26 (II) INSPECTOR I - GRADE 082;

27 (III) INSPECTOR II - GRADE 085;

28 (IV) ACCOUNTING ASSISTANT II - GRADE 085;

29 (V) SECRETARY III - GRADE 086;

30 (VI) OFFICE SUPERVISOR - GRADE 087;

31 (VII) ADMINISTRATIVE COORDINATOR - GRADE 90;

32 (VIII) ASSISTANT CHIEF INSPECTOR - GRADE 090; AND

33 (IX) CHIEF INSPECTOR - GRADE 093.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 October 1, 1998.
