CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages - License on Deposit**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing an alcoholic beverages licensee to place a license on
4 deposit with the Board of License Commissioners for not more than a certain
5 period of time under certain circumstances; requiring that at the end of a certain
6 period of time the license expires unless a certain application has been approved
7 or is pending approval; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally
8 relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Baltimore City.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 10-504(d) through (f), respectively, of Article 2B -
22 Alcoholic Beverages of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be
23 Section(s) 10-504(e) through (g), respectively.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland
2 read as follows:

3 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

4 10-504.

5 (D)(1) IN BALTIMORE CITY, AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LICENSE MAY BE PLACED
6 ON DEPOSIT WITH THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS FOR NOT MORE THAN
7 180 DAYS IF:

8 (I) THE LICENSEE EXPERIENCES A PERSONAL OR FINANCIAL
9 HARDSHIP;

10 (II) THE LICENSEE HAS NOT BEEN EVICTED FROM THE LICENSED
11 PREMISES; AND

12 (III) THE LICENSED PREMISES IS NOT BEING USED FOR ANY OTHER
13 BUSINESS PURPOSE.

14 (2) THE LICENSE EXPIRES AFTER 180 DAYS UNLESS ONE OF THE
15 FOLLOWING APPLICATIONS IS APPROVED OR IS PENDING APPROVAL:

16 (I) AN APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF A TRANSFER OF THE
17 LICENSE TO ANOTHER LOCATION OR ASSIGNMENT TO ANOTHER PERSON UNDER §
18 10-503 OF THIS SUBTITLE; OR

19 (II) APPLICATION FOR PERMISSION TO CONTINUE THE BUSINESS
20 AFTER THE DEATH OF THE LICENSEE UNDER § 10-506 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
22 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety,
23 has been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
24 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
25 the date it is enacted.
