6 (c) Unless otherwise expressly provided by a lease for premises on which 7 lottery tickets are sold, whenever lottery tickets are sold by a licensed agent on 8 premises subject to rent that is wholly or partially based on a percentage of gross 9 sales or receipts, the tenant responsible for payment of the rent may calculate that 10 portion of the rent arising from the sale of lottery tickets solely on the basis of:

11 (1) the commission received by the licensed agent on the sale of those 12 tickets; and

13 (2) in the case of instant lottery tickets, the difference between the price 14 paid by the licensed agent in purchasing the tickets from the Agency and the price for 15 which they were sold by the agent.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 October 1, 1998.

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
