BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 17 **Article - Natural Resources** 18 4 1033. 19 <del>(a)</del> The Department shall adopt rules and regulations assuring that a tidal 20 fish license authorizes a person to use only one hydraulic clam dredge. The 21 Department also shall adopt rules and regulations requiring all licensees operating a

22 hydraulic clam dredge owned by another person, or subject to a lien held by another

1 person to have the license in possession when engaged in licensed activities and to 2 affix the license identification number permanently to the vessel as required in § 3 4 701(h) of this article. 4 (b) (1)The Department shall adopt rules and regulations governing 5 licensing of persons buying, selling, shipping, transporting, or otherwise dealing in soft-shell clams, and the methods by which they may do so. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
