A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Foster Care - Child Support Obligations

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Social Services Administration to adopt regulations
- 4 that mandate background checks for child support arrearages for certain foster
- 5 parents who are also biological parents; requiring the Social Services
- 6 Administration to adopt regulations that mandate that certain foster parents be
- 7 given a certain time period to pay delinquent child support obligations before
- 8 any action is taken with regard to the placement of foster children; and
- 9 generally relating to the placement of foster children.
- 10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 11 Article Family Law

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 Article - Family Law

- 18 5-525.
- 19 (g) The Administration shall adopt regulations that:
- 20 (1) for the 12-month period beginning on October 1, 1983, and for each
- 21 subsequent 12-month period, establish specific goals as to the maximum number of
- 22 children who will remain in foster care for more than 2 years;
- 23 (2) prohibit a local department from seeking the custody or guardianship
- 24 of a child for placement in foster care solely because the child's parent or guardian
- 25 lacks shelter; [and]
- 26 (3) require the local department to make appropriate referrals to
- 27 emergency shelter and other services for families with children who lack shelter;

- 1 (4) REQUIRE THAT A BACKGROUND CHECK OF ANY CHILD SUPPORT
- 2 OBLIGATIONS AND ARREARAGES BE CONDUCTED ON A PROSPECTIVE FOSTER
- 3 PARENT WHO IS ALSO A BIOLOGICAL PARENT PRIOR TO THE PLACEMENT OF A
- 4 FOSTER CHILD;
- 5 (5) REQUIRE THAT ANY PROSPECTIVE FOSTER PARENT WHOSE CHILD
- 6 SUPPORT PAYMENTS ARE IN ARREARS WILL BE GIVEN 60 DAYS TO BRING THE
- 7 OBLIGATION CURRENT BEFORE A DECISION IS MADE WHETHER TO PLACE A FOSTER
- 8 CHILD WITH THE PROSPECTIVE PARENT; AND
- 9 (6) REQUIRE THAT DURING THE TIME AN INDIVIDUAL IS A FOSTER
- 10 PARENT, IF THE INDIVIDUAL'S CHILD SUPPORT PAYMENTS ARE IN ARREARS, HE OR
- 11 SHE WILL HAVE 30 DAYS TO BRING THE OBLIGATION CURRENT BEFORE ANY
- 12 DECISION IS MADE WHETHER TO REMOVE A FOSTER CHILD FROM THE INDIVIDUAL'S
- 13 HOME.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 October 1, 1998.
