- WHEREAS, At the same time the population of the State is aging, the advent of
- 21 managed care has resulted in numerous changes in the delivery of health care in the
- 22 State that seek to reduce the cost of health care, including reductions in the length of
- 23 hospital stays; and
- 24 WHEREAS, As a result of these changes, care is being provided in a variety of
- 25 settings, including the homes of individuals, assisted living facilities, hospitals, and
- 26 long-term care facilities; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Nursing assistants play an important role in providing care in all of
- 28 these settings; and
- 29 WHEREAS, The Federal Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1987 recognized the
- 30 benefit of regulating nursing assistants who work in nursing homes by establishing
- 31 minimal educational requirements and requiring registration of nursing assistants
- 32 who work in nursing homes; and
- WHEREAS, Nursing assistants who work in other settings in the State are not
- 34 currently regulated; and
- 35 WHEREAS, Because of the absence of regulation, there is not a central
- 36 repository for the collection of complaints and investigations of alleged disciplinary
- 37 problems relating to nursing assistants; now, therefore,
