2 Vehicle Laws - Speeding Violations - Increasing Fines

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Chief Judge of the District Court, in adopting the
- 4 penalty deposit schedule for the prepayment of fines imposed for violations of
- 5 the Maryland Vehicle Law, to increase certain fines for speeding violations
- 6 occurring in certain speed zones; requiring the Chief Judge of the District Court
- 7 each year to adjust, in a certain manner, the fines specified in the penalty
- 8 deposit schedule for certain speeding violations; and generally relating to fines
- 9 for speeding violations.

10 Preamble

- WHEREAS, It is the legislative intent of the General Assembly of Maryland that
- 12 the safety of drivers and pedestrians on our roads be protected to the greatest extent
- 13 possible; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The speed limits set by the State Highway Administration are
- 15 intended to reflect the prudent and safe speed at which drivers may reasonably
- 16 operate their vehicles; and
- WHEREAS, The establishment of speed limits under 35 miles per hour (mph)
- 18 reflects safety concerns related to the residential or commercial nature of the
- 19 community adjacent to the highway, road conditions, limited sight lines, and other
- 20 factors; and
- 21 WHEREAS, There is an increasingly large number of drivers who violate the
- 22 speed limit in areas where the limit is under 35 mph; and
- 23 WHEREAS, There is a particular need for increased penalties to deter drivers
- 24 from violating the speed limits in areas where the limit is under 35 mph; now,
- 25 therefore,
- 26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 27 MARYLAND, That:

- 1 (a) For the purposes of the prepayment of fines imposed for violations of the
- 2 Maryland Vehicle Law, the Chief Judge of the District Court, in adopting the penalty
- 3 deposit schedule, shall double the fines in effect as of October 1, 1997 for exceeding
- 4 the speed limit in an under 35 mile per hour speed zone.
- 5 (b) The Chief Judge of the District Court, when reevaluating the fines
- 6 contained in the penalty deposit schedule, each year, shall adjust the fines for
- 7 exceeding the speed limit in an under 35 mile per hour speed zone as necessary to
- 8 maintain the relationship established under this Act between the fines for speeding in
- 9 a 35 miles per hour speed zone and the fines specified for other speed limit violations.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 11 October 1, 1998.
