## A BILL ENTITLED

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2	Home- and Community-Based Services for Persons with Alzheimer's
3	Disease and Related Disorders - Medicaid Waiver

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to apply
- 5 to the federal Health Care Financing Administration for a certain home- and
- 6 community-based services waiver to provide certain services to certain
- 7 individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; requiring the
- 8 Department to conduct a certain study and report the results of the study to the
- 9 General Assembly; and generally relating to the provision of certain services to
- 10 certain individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

- 21 Preamble
- WHEREAS, Approximately 4 million Americans 1 in 10 persons over age 65
- 23 and nearly half of those over age 85, as well as a small percentage of people in their
- 24 40's and 50's have Alzheimer's disease; and
- 25 WHEREAS, In a 1993 national survey 19 million Americans say they have a
- 26 family member with Alzheimer's disease, and 37 million know someone with
- 27 Alzheimer's; and

- 1 WHEREAS, 70,000 Maryland residents have Alzheimer's disease or a related 2 disorder; and
- WHEREAS, In the United States, approximately \$100 billion a year is spent on
- 4 care for Alzheimer's disease and neither Medicare nor private health insurance covers
- 5 the long-term care most persons with Alzheimer's need; and
- 6 WHEREAS, 7 of 10 persons with Alzheimer's disease live at home, more than
- 7 75% of home care is provided by family and friends, and the remainder is paid care
- 8 costing an average of \$12,500 per year, with families paying almost all of the cost
- 9 out-of-pocket; and
- WHEREAS, Nationally, half of all nursing home patients suffer from
- 11 Alzheimer's disease or a related disorder, and the average cost of care in a nursing
- 12 home is \$42,000 per year; and
- WHEREAS, In Maryland, nursing home expenditures account for 89% of
- 14 Medicaid long-term care spending and 27% of the total Medicaid provider
- 15 reimbursements budgeted for Fiscal Year 1999; and
- WHEREAS, The long-term care system should accommodate the preferences of
- 17 consumers who prefer to remain independent and in their own homes and the
- 18 community for as long as possible; and
- 19 WHEREAS, States such as Wisconsin, Oregon, and Colorado that have made a
- 20 concerted commitment to home- and community-based care have reduced projected
- 21 nursing home use between 18% and 39% and have saved 9% to 23% in projected
- 22 long-term care costs; and
- WHEREAS, The State-funded respite program, established by the General
- 24 Assembly in 1988, served over 700 functionally disabled individuals in 1997, yet still
- 25 has over 200 individuals on a waiting list; now, therefore,
- 26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 28 Article Health General
- 29 1-101.
- 30 (a) In this article the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 31 (c) "Department" means the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

- 33 (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPLY TO THE HEALTH CARE FINANCING
- 34 ADMINISTRATION OF THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN
- 35 SERVICES FOR A HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICES WAIVER UNDER §
- 36 1915(C) OF THE FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY ACT (42 U.S.C. § 1396(N)) IN ORDER TO

## **SENATE BILL 481**

- 1 RECEIVE FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO 2 INDIVIDUALS WHO:
- 3 (1) HAVE ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED DISORDERS;
- 4 (2) ARE AGE 60 OR OLDER;
- 5 (3) HAVE FAMILY INCOME NOT GREATER THAN 200% OF THE FEDERAL
- 6 POVERTY LEVEL; AND
- 7 (4) WOULD OTHERWISE REQUIRE NURSING HOME
- 8 INSTITUTIONALIZATION.
- 9 (B) THE SERVICES COVERED UNDER THE WAIVER UNDER THIS SECTION 10 SHALL INCLUDE:
- 11 (1) ROUTINE AND EMERGENCY RESPITE CARE;
- 12 (2) ADULT DAY CARE;
- 13 (3) PERSONAL CARE;
- 14 (4) CASE MANAGEMENT; AND
- 15 (5) HOMEMAKER SERVICES.
- 16 (C) THE DEPARTMENT MAY PLACE A REASONABLE LIMIT ON THE NUMBER OF
- 17 INDIVIDUALS OR ON THE GEOGRAPHIC AREA OF THE STATE INCLUDED IN THE
- 18 WAIVER UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 19 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
- 20 Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the Alzheimer's Association and
- 21 other interested parties, shall conduct a study to determine the number and
- 22 characteristics of individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders who
- 23 might benefit most from the Medicaid waiver under Section 1 of this Act and for
- 24 whom the waiver would be most cost effective. The Department, subject to § 2-1246 of
- 25 the State Government Article, shall report the results of its study to the Senate
- 26 Finance Committee, the House Environmental Matters Committee, and the General
- 27 Assembly by December 1, 1998.
- 28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 29 effect July 1, 1998.
